

A Tribute to M. Edmund Vallejo, Ph.D.
September 10, 1929—July 7, 2020

A longtime friend, colleague and mentor to many in the Pueblo community, Dr. Edmund Vallejo left us earlier this summer. True to his word, he left Pueblo a much better place than when he arrived 90 years earlier. A religious man, Dr. V was guided by the good Lord throughout his life driving him to always do good for as many as possible by caring and giving. That he did

As a lifelong professional educator, he had so many outstanding qualities making him a great leader. Without a doubt, he was a kind and gentle man who was also honest, trusting, respectful, and intelligent. One quality that separated him from most others was that even during the toughest of times, he never had an unkind word to say about anyone. He handled everything he did with integrity, class and dignity. Moreover, regardless of the task, Dr. V did it with enthusiasm and love for the youth of Pueblo. He was driven to help underserved students by mentoring over one hundred potential high school dropouts during his retirement.

By any measure Dr. V had an exemplary career. He served his country in the Navy during the Korean War. He served School District No. 60 for 36 years ending as its first Hispanic Superintendent. Also, he was the president of the local chapter of the American Federation of Teachers. In addition, he was a professional photographer and a lover of nature evidenced by his many visits to the mountains and his beautiful published nature photography books.

Forever a teacher, Dr. V had few peers. In his last years as Superintendent he asked the Board of Education to allow him to teach one class at Risley while performing all his other duties. He loved teaching and he loved Risley.

As a high-quality school administrator, he never took advantage of his leadership positions to influence others regarding his political views. In this regard he was ethical about all matters with his actions speaking louder than his words. Nevertheless, he always embodied the principles of our modern Democrat Party in everything he did. He was always looking to help others.

Dr. V will forever be in our hearts and in our minds. He was a wonderful man, a true gentleman and always above reproach.

Ballot questions referred by the General Assembly or any political subdivision are listed by letter, and ballot questions initiated by the people are listed numerically. A ballot question listed as an "amendment" proposes a change to the Colorado Constitution, and a ballot question listed as a "proposition" proposes a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes."

Be an informed voter ... study the issues and cast your vote. Having mail-in ballots provides time for you to look them over.
